READ CHAPTER 6:

- 1. Dead in sin, alive in Christ. Paul begins this chapter asking what seems to be a ridiculous question, and yet there are many who believe they can come to Christ and remain unchanged. What do you think? We in Christ are now dead to sin, what does that mean?**

- 2. What does it mean to baptized *into* Christ? Baptized into his death?**

- 3. How are we to live in “newness of life”? What does this mean?**

- 4. In verse 6, Paul says “that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.” Who is this “old man” he speaks of?**

5. If the “body of sin” has been destroyed, does that mean we will never again struggle with sinful thoughts? Sinful acts?

6. Paul makes the comparison that if we are dead with Christ, then we must also be alive with Christ. What does this mean?

7. In verse 9, Paul chooses the word dominion. What does dominion convey?

8. I like the word yield – what does it mean to yield? Why do you think Paul chose to express our response to God as “yielded”?

9. In verses 14 and 15 Paul makes a declaration disguised as a question. If we are no longer under the law, slaves to the law but freed by Grace, aren't we "free" to do as we please? And if we are free to live as we please, why does he speak of being a servant of the Lord? Servant surely meaning "one who serves the will of another."

10. In verses 21 and 22 Paul sums it up by drawing our attention to the fruit we can expect from our choices. What is the fruit of righteousness or serving God?

11. What is meant by "the wages of sin is death?" Mustn't we all die someday?
