READ CHAPTER 8:18 - 9

- 1. Verse 8:18. . . “For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.” How does this help the believer – us – endure while we are on the earth? Does it?**

- 2. Verses 19-22 Paul talks about the creatures... what are they waiting for? Why?**

- 3. Look at verse 23 . . . do you ever find yourself “groaning” for heaven? Restless to begin eternity?**

- 4. Verse 24. . . Hope that is seen is not hope. Why?**

5. Verse 26 . . . this is one we lean on in prayer often. We don't always know how to pray, what to pray for. So, the Lord makes intercession for us. Have you ever relied on the Lord to pray for you, through you?

6. Verse 27: "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose." Is this true in your life? Do ALL things really work together for good?

7. What about the next verse? "For whom he did foreknow, he also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren?" How does that fit with the verse that came before it?

8. Verse 30: “Moreover whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified.” Looking at each word here what do they mean?

13. Paul reassures us that we - who are in Christ- are now MORE than conquerors. There is nothing to separate us from the love of God. . .why is that good news? Do you know anything else that is that absolute? How does knowing this help us with our daily struggles?

14. How can the things we learned in this chapter help us be a light for others who do not know Jesus?
