Chapters 9 - 10: The Power of the Lord to Bring Life

We begin this chapter with the conversion of Paul. It can be argued that Paul was the most profound conversion recorded in the scriptures. He goes from persecutor of saints, to champion of the faith, from Jewish Pharisee to Christian Apostle, from Roman citizen to Roman prisoner.

1. What is the significance of him being knocked of his horse?

3. He is told to go to Damascus to a particular man named Ananias. He must have wondered if he would be received. We see the Lord speaks to Ananias through the Holy Spirit. Notice his response in verses 9:13-9:14. Why does he obey?

4. In verse 9:16 we see a foreshadow of the suffering Paul endures for the Gospel. As we read through the Book of Acts and the epistles that Paul writes to the early churches, th suffering is chronicled. How does he suffer? Can you think of some examples that you heread?

13. As Peter he shares the message of salvation and what happens? Who responds?
